Mission Mill Museum Association, \$25,000

FY06 Cultural Development Grant: To support the restoration of the Thomas Kay Woolen Mill Building, an 1889 industrial woolen mill associated with Oregon pioneer and Methodist minister Jason Lee, and now on the National Register of Historic Places. Restoration will include repoint masonry on three sides of the building, removal and containment of original lead paint, ultraviolet light protection on south-facing windows and the replacement of the roof, gutters and cornices. Additional restoration work will include repairs to the turbine enclosures, the Shaft Building, and the Machine Shop.
