Marylhurst University/The Art Gym, \$5,000

FY07 Cultural Development Grant: To support phase one of a two-year museum tour of “Ken Butler: Hybrid Visions”. Collaborating with the Hallie Ford Museum at Willamette University, Marylhurst will bring the New York-based native Oregonian’s exhibit of “hybrid instruments” — film reel and tennis racket guitars, cowboy boot violins, axe cellos and Styrofoam packing pianos, to both museums for exhibition that will also include performances by Butler on these instruments at each venue. Butler’s work has been shown and performed at the Stedelijk Museum in Amsterdam, Brooklyn Museum, Lincoln Center and the Metropolitan Museum of Art; and has been featured on PBS, CNN, MTV and NBC’s Tonight Show.

FY07 Cultural Development Grant: To support the Timberline Lodge Amphitheatre Project at the National Historic Landmark Timberline Lodge on Mt. Hood. Funds for this project will help to

rehabilitate and preserve for the public's use the 1937 WPA era outdoor amphitheatre that was once an important venue for performances, ceremonies and interpretive activities, but has suffered from neglect and damage due to weather conditions. Reconstruction efforts will include replacement of the deteriorating wooden benches, providing adequate water detention and runoff management, and making the amphitheatre wheelchair accessible.
